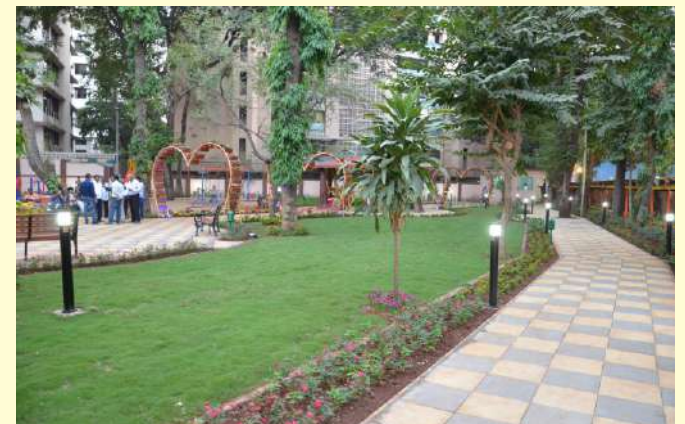

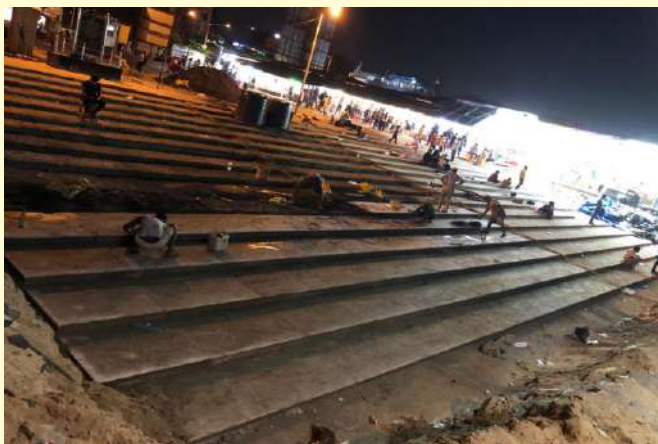

Gilbert Hill wall work starts, encroachers pelt stones

Mumbai: On Thursday, the public works department (PWD) started work on construction of a retaining wall around Andheri's Gilbert Hill, which is a Grade 2 heritage structure. The MLA from the area, Ameet Satam, who has been demanding that a retaining wall be constructed, said that doing so would prevent any kind of encroachment from taking place at the foothills.

"There was some stone pelting by encroachers who have settled at Gilbert Hill, but the local police were able to control the situation," said Satam, who plans to develop the spot as a tourist attraction. Recently, the BMC along with other agencies had decided upon ways in which all agencies could work together in preserving this heritage structure. TNN

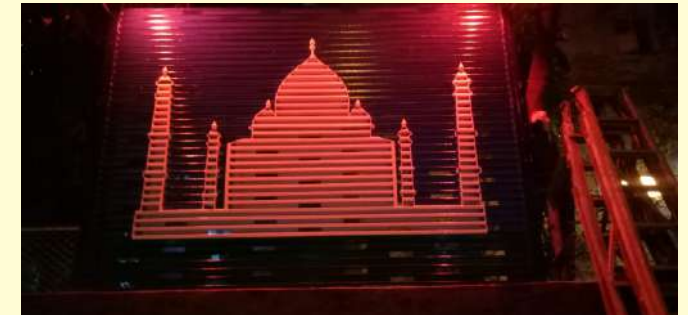

Home buyers to get property tax rebates in green buildings

Home buyers and developers can soon get a waiver of development charges and property tax rebates if they buy a home or build green buildings. The state urban development department last week issued the state's new green building policy under which, builders and housing societies obtaining the green building certificate can seek rebates on taxes and development charges.

According to the policy, builders can avail rebate of up to 10 per cent on development charges and societies or home buyers can get a rebate on property tax up to 10 per cent. A senior state government official said that the department has invited public suggestions and objections on the policy and will soon conduct hearings.

"Property buyers in green buildings will be entitled to a property tax rebate for a period of five years from securing the Occupancy Certificate (OC) based on the green building rating of the property. Depending on the rating of the property, the rebate amount will be fixed. Buyers of homes in a five-star or platinum rating would get rebate of 10 per cent in property tax while those with four-star or gold and three-star or silver ratings would get rebate of 7.5 per cent and 5 per cent, respectively in the property tax," the official said.

BJP legislator, Ameet Satam, who has first pitched for a green policy welcomed the move. "This was the need of the hour. The green policy will promote eco-friendly buildings and it will give an incentive for people and developers to buy and build green buildings. The state government must promote this policy, especially in urban areas where there is a severe stress on the environment. This is a step towards sustainable development and has many aspects like solar panels, sewerage treatment plants, organic waste converters and green facades to reduce electricity consumption," Satam said. Satam had demanded a green building policy in July this year.

Officials said that despite the state government's push for the green buildings policy, local municipal corporation will have to offer additional incentives at its level over and above the incentives mentioned by the state government. "Only then can the policy be more effective. Big municipal corporations like the BMC must give additional benefits given the scale and cost of development in the city," the official explained.

Officials said the policy would also provide rebate on development charges to developers securing a green building certification from empowered agencies in accordance to the rating secured by them. Those with the platinum rating would get rebate of 7.5 per cent in the development charges while those with gold and silver ratings would get rebate of 5 and 2.5 per cent, respectively in development charges.

"Green buildings lead to a marginal increase in the construction cost and the government, taking cognizance of it, has offered incentives to developers to ensure that the extra cost is not passed down to the consumer. The consumers are also given incentives to nudge them towards green developments through regular buildings," officials said.

Officials said that municipal corporations must modify its standard operating procedure for building permissions to reflect the changes mentioned in the policy. The developer may apply for a refund of the development charges after submission of the final certificate. The corporation will have to maintain the list of green buildings to ensure that the property tax rebate are reflected directly into the tax invoice.

The state government would soon be signing a MoU with TERI-GRIHA (Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment) and GBCI-LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) to certify the buildings as green buildings, officials said.

"The policy would be applicable to all upcoming commercial as well as residential buildings. Commercial buildings include offices, IT parks, banks, shopping malls, hotels, hospitals, airports, stadiums, convention centres, education institutes, libraries and museums," another official said.

Green activists said the building industry accounts for 40 per cent of global energy and water consumption and almost 48 per cent of solid waste generated. The green buildings have benefits of reduction in water and energy consumption. Energy saving ranges from 20 to 30 per cent while water savings from 30 to 50 per cent.

Citizens having any suggestions or objections on the draft policy should submit it within a period of one month from now.

Act against squatters, else I'll squat: Satam

Municipal Commissioner Ajoy Mehta might have ordered officials to remove encroachments on footpaths across the city on an urgent basis, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has failed to do anything in this regard, alleged BJP on Sunday.

According to Ameet Satam, BJP legislator from Andheri (W), the BMC hasn't taken any sustained action against illegal encroachments. He has even threatened that if the situation doesn't improve soon, he will construct an illegal shanty on an Andheri (W) footpath and live there.

Satam has given the civic body a list of 16 locations where encroach-

ments have taken over the pavements, leaving no space for pedestrians to walk on. "I have been continuously complaining and pointing out these encroachments for 11 months now. There seems to be no sustained action

that eliminates these shanties permanently. They come back as soon as the drive is over," Satam said in his letter to Mehta.

"If there is no visible change within the next 15 days, I will be forced to sit on a dharna," the letter added. Kishor Kumar Ganguly Marg, JP Road, Caesar Road, Versova beach, Juhu Church Road and Juhu-Versova Link Road are some of the locations mentioned in Satam's letter.

In November last year, Satam had launched a massive drive to clean up the Andheri beach. The drive included demolition of over 100 shanties and involved nearly 200 officials from various departments led by Satam. The shanties, however, returned and the same exercise had to

repeated this year as well.

In an order issued last week, Mehta has asked all the 24 ward offices in the city to make the footpaths free of encroachment by unauthorised hawkers, hotels, furniture shops, among others. While launching the drive, Mehta had said that the BMC will ensure that footpaths stayed free and encroachments did not take place again. For the purpose he had even asked the officials to make a three-month rotating plan.

A senior civic official said, "We have been asked to prepare a three-month rotating plan to ensure a sustained drive. We also have to collect photographic evidence. According to the plan, we have to set a target for each month and submit a report."

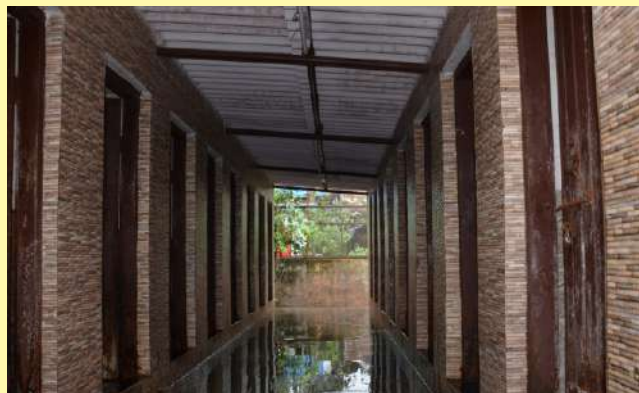

City gets 1st floating trash broom at Irla pumping stn

Mumbai: In a first for the city the BMC on Monday started installing floating trash brooms that are expected to arrest floating garbage like thermocol and plastic, preventing them from entering the sea.

On Monday, the first trash broom was installed at the Irla pumping station. Civic officials said that in all seven trash brooms will be installed by June 2, before the onset of the monsoon. The locations will be: Dahisar, Poisar, Oshiwara, Mithi River, Mogra Nullah, and Lovegrove pumping station. The set of mega brooms were bought in Kolkata for Rs.11 crore.

V Khankar, the BMC's chief engineer of storm water drains (SWD) said the trash brooms will be placed at critical locations close to river or nullah outfalls into the sea or creek. "At present, garbage from nullahs and rivers enter the sea, only to be deposited on the beaches. We hope that once the brooms are installed, this will

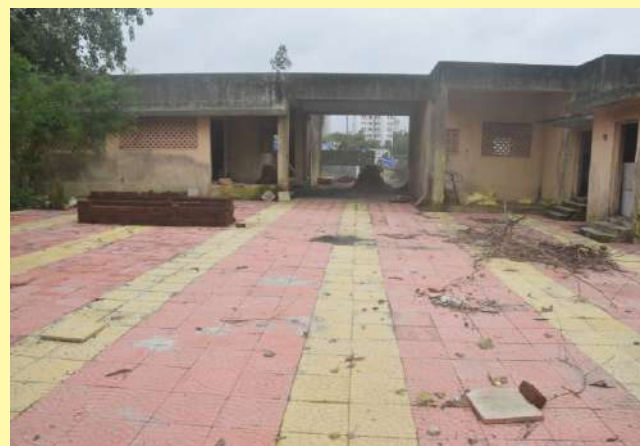
not occur," he said. It may be collected that the civic commissioner, in the BMC budget earlier this year, had proposed bringing in trash brooms.

BJP MLA Ameet Satam, who was present during the installation of the Irla pumping station trash broom on Monday said that in October last year, he had taken up the matter of installing giant water brooms with the municipal commissioner and the chief minister. In a letter to Satam, the SWD department has said that upon the successful installation

of trash brooms at the designated locations, and observing their benefit to the marine environment, the civic body would undertake such work on a large scale, including mechanical collection of trash. "This was much needed and I am glad that the civic body has implemented the suggestion. Just beach cleaning is not a solution and it was essential that steps were taken to arrest garbage at source. We are also working on a comprehensive beach cleaning policy for both Juhu and Versova," said Satam.

Survey identifies over 7,000 hutments near Juhu airport

SRA completes biometric survey of residents, most of whom are eligible for in-situ rehabilitation

The Slum Rehabilitation Authority (SRA) has identified over 7,000 hutments in slums abutting the Juhu airport and completed the biometric survey of its residents – most of whom will be eligible for in situ (at the same place) rehabilitation. The survey covered Indira Nagar, Shivaji Nagar and Nehru Nagar slums.

“It was a major exercise, involving five teams of officers, to identify the beneficiaries. This is a major step towards the redevelopment and rehabilitation of slums,” said Deepak Kapoor, Chief Executive Officer (CEO), SRA. The authority had begun the biometric survey of residents in March but hit a roadblock after rumours spread that the survey was for ex-situ (off

site) rehabilitation. CM Devendra Fadnavis had in March promised in-situ rehabilitation for those living on slums adjacent to the Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport (CSIA) and Juhu airports, thereby putting an end to residents’ fears that they will be moved out.

A senior SRA official said that residents of hutments which were erected before 2000 are eligible for free homes. “However, those who moved in between 2000 and 2011 will be charged for the new homes,” the official said.

Fadnavis had promised in-situ rehabilitation for those living in slums adjacent to the CSIA and Juhu airports

BJP legislator from Andheri (West), Ameet Satam, who had raised the issue in the Assembly last week, said the completion of the survey was a major victory. “This is a big step in the long term rehabilitation of the slum dwellers and redevelopment of the airport land. It is a big relief to lakhs of slum dwellers and will pave the way for a slum free airport land,” Satam said.

MLA plans memorial for Keenan, Reuben in Amboli

Mumbai: Soon after their killers were sentenced for life on Thursday, Amboli's slain sons Keenan Santos and Reuben Fernandes are set to receive a unique memorial in their locality.

Andheri legislator Ameet Satam will dedicate a temporary pillar in their honour just opposite the spot where the boys were killed. "I have allocated money from my MLA funds for a beautiful central median along the lines of the one in Shanghai," Satam said. "It will have railings, flower pots and plants. We will install a temporary pillar dedicated to Keenan and Reuben. Work will begin on Monday and the median will be inaugurated by the boys' families in the last week of May or the first week of June," he added. The median could also

BMC demolishes illegal unit on Juhu Tara Road at MLA's insistence

After complaining for a decade about the illegal construction in their compound by a designer clothes store owner, residents of Asha Colony finally saw some action. The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) demolished the illegal extensions made by KJ May, located on the ground floor of the Asha Colony B wing on Juhu Tara Road, on Monday.

The action was taken after local MLA Ameet Satam took up the issue. He was also present throughout the demolition process. Meanwhile residents also alleged harassment by Pradeep Hirani, founder and chairman of Kinaya Fashion, who owns 14 units in the colony, including two bungalows. One of the residents, Meenaz Bhatti, even registered an FIR at Santa Cruz police station, alleging she was threatened with dire consequences for the demolition.

"The society has several issues with Hirani, including his taking over as chairman of the society and even threatening the members to ensure that they sold their houses to him at lower prices. Apart from all that, we have been filing complaints with BMC about the illegal extensions made by the Kinaya store but not a single demolition ever took place for reasons unknown. In fact, once the BMC and police came with machines but left without doing anything," alleged Bhatti.

She added that they had given up hope but then with the help of some friends they met Satam, who promised them demolition on Tuesday, but got it done a day before.

Satam said the residents, mostly senior citizens, had approached him and told him about the ongoing issue with Hirani. "I felt these members were ex-



tremely scared of Hirani and needed help. I checked with BMC and asked them to take necessary action against illegal extensions. To my surprise, BMC told me on Monday that they were ready but for the police deployment. So I spoke to the DCP and immediately got the cops deployed."

Satam added that he received calls from residents saying that BMC was again wasting time and so he decided to go to the spot himself and ensure that the work was done.

The MLA, who has already earned a name himself for working in close coordination with resident groups,

also said Bhatti informed her of the threat that was made by Hirani, to which he suggested that she should register a case.

"I met the senior citizens staying in the colony and most of them are around 80 years of age. They are scared and told me that they were being threatened to sell their houses and leave the colony. Since it was a matter of safety of senior citizens, I spoke to the police and asked them to raise the phone calls made by the residents of this colony seriously," said Satam.

Efforts were made to reach Hirani but he could not be contacted.

BMC orders probe against 26 officials for corruption

The BMC on Wednesday ordered a high-level probe into allegations of corruption against 26 officials and engineers. Civic Chief Ajoy Mehta has set up a 2-member panel for the job and asked them to submit a report in 60 days.

The investigation follows allegations of corruption in the corporation's building proposal department, levelled in the budget session of the assembly.

BJP legislator Ameet Satam had alleged that top BMC officials conspired with builders to grant clearances in selective cases only. The lawmaker from Andheri (W) said the scam was worth Rs 50,000 crore.

As per Mehta's order (Mirror has a copy), the inquiry will be conducted by additional municipal commissioners Sanjay Mukherjee and Sanjay Deshpande.

Deputy Municipal Commissioner Ram Dhas is the chief officer in the BMC. There is a unit operates in the BMC. Only certain buildings are given occupation certificates despite gross violations. On the other hand, genuine institutions like schools are harassed," Satam had claimed in the assembly, demanding a high-level probe.

Dhas was the BMC's chief accountant (finance) and is currently heading its central purchase department. Satam had also accused deputy municipal commissioners Sudhir Nall and Rajeev Kukunoor of receiving kickbacks.

Sanjay Mahale, Sandip Gaiwal, Shantilal Tank and Ketan Doshi are among the engineers who are under the scanner.

Following Satam's allegations, Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis had asked Mehta to "examine and inquire" the matter. Meanwhile, Satam has written to the Anti-Corruption Bureau requesting for a probe by the agency. "All these officers own properties worth over Rs 1000 crore," he wrote in his letter.

One of the officers under the lens sought to downplay the development. "Mehta has asked the committee to look into the matter. This is not a formal investigation."

partment of the BMC. He also named Rajeev Kukunoor former chief engineer of the development planning and building proposals department, Amol Dala, Ketan Doshi, Sandeep Gaiwal, Mahale, Saniche, Moshram, Bandu Patil all engineers in the DP and BP departments.

The MLA named several BMC officials indulging in corruption, stating that the bribe amount was as high as Rs 2000-3000 per sq ft. He also mentioned Rao, Bangar and Tank from the BMC who were posted in Slum Rehabilitation Authority.

"There are 3,674 files related to various building permissions from Bandra Khar Road, Vile Parle and Andheri area which are missing. Each file leads to corruption of Rs 5 crore, means totalling Rs 18,000 crore," he alleged.

Congress MLA Amin Patel also demanded an inquiry by SIT and ACR.

In 2005, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) planned a desalination plant but the idea was dropped as it needed a huge space, advanced technology and involved high costs.

Satam in his letter wrote: "We are witnessing an erratic monsoon, we can no longer depend on rains to fulfill our water needs in the near future. Hence,

to protect our city we need to evaluate the possibility of setting up a desalination plant. Such experiment has been successfully done in Chennai and the deserts of Middle East where they no longer depend on rainfall for their water needs. The BMC must also look into this option."

"The civic body has already imposed a water cut of 20%, which can be further increased to 50% owing to water shortages. Civic officials said there are no plans to set up the plants. "We see no need, saying that it rains in September and October as water stock is too low to last till next monsoon. Desalination plants are long term projects that will take at least three years to be operational. A decision on long term projects will be taken after sometime. We are not in a dire situation. We are in a situation where we need to be realistic," said a senior civic official, who did not wish to be named.

The Public Works Department recently cleared the proposal to beautify the spot and install a capsule lift to give visitors a panoramic view of the city from the hill.

"Our inspection report has found that the developer had been carrying out excavation activity beyond the stipulated permission. I have asked that an offence be registered against the developer for hiding the facts and causing damage to the heritage structure," Kurve told Mirror.

He said that his office will be writing to Municipal Commissioner Praveen Parsheti, asking the BMC to also take action against Cordone. Last month, Mayor Vishwanath Mahadeshwar had also written to the Municipal Commissioner seeking stern action against the developer.

City gets 1st floating trash broom at Irla pumping stn

Mumbai: In a first for the city, the BMC on Monday started installing floating trash brooms that are expected to arrest floating garbage like thermocol and plastic, preventing them from entering the sea.

On Monday the first trash broom was installed at the Irla pumping station. Civic officials said that in all seven trash brooms will be installed by June 2, before the onset of the monsoon. The locations will be Dahisar, Poisar, Oshiwara, Mithi River, Mogra Nullah, and Lovegrove pumping station. The set of mega brooms were bought in Kolkata for Rs.11 crore.

V Khankar, the BMC's chief engineer of storm water drains (SWD) said the trash brooms will be placed at critical locations close to river or nullah outfalls into the sea or creek. "At present, garbage from nullahs and rivers enter the sea, only to be deposited on the beaches. We hope that once the brooms are installed, this will

not occur," he said. It may be relegated that the civic commissioner, in the BMC budget for this year, had proposed bringing in trash brooms.

BJP MLA Ameet Satam, who was present during the installation of the Irla pumping station trash broom on Monday, said that in October last year, he had taken up the matter of installing giant water brooms with the municipal commissioner and the chief minister. In a letter to Satam, the SWD department has said that upon the successful installation

of trash brooms at the designated locations, and observing their benefit to the marine environment, the civic body would undertake such work on a large scale, including mechanical collection of trash. Local BJP legislator Ameet Satam said they had written to the SNIT authorities on Monday to open their internal road. "The entire traffic load has shifted to S.V. Road. After a lot of persuasion, we have managed to get a small road that goes from inside SNIT University opened so that some traffic can be diverted there. Unfortunately, there are no leaders for demolition and reconstruction in place yet, which is likely to keep the stretch that for a prolonged period," said Satam.

The SNIT Women's University's principal Deepshikha Deshpande issued an NOC to BMC and traffic warden. "There are at least 5,000 students studying and 100 students living on the campus. Hence we request the presence of two female cops on this road. This security for students and staff is crucial because motorists from Juhu road will make use of this internal road from the university, but keeping in mind the inconvenience caused to motorists, in the interest of the public, we are agreeing to this based on certain conditions... A boat chowky should be present for safety of girls for traffic department. There should be CCTV cameras installed from the main gate open to the exit point in Juhu road. For any untoward incident, BMC, as state government will take responsibility. The internal road repair work will be undertaken by BMC, as state government. The litter and garbage accumulation on campus or motorists in the internal road will be cleaned by BMC."

Regarding the college's demands, Satam said, "We have assured them that there will be no problems for the University functioning. We are also setting up a police boat chowky on the road so that there complete safety for their students. We are also going to fence off some areas for the safety and security of the women in the campus," Satam added.

Traffic Summit chairman Malawadekar blamed the BMC for the traffic chaos caused by this road closure. "After the CSMT foot-over-bridge collapse, they are afraid of being arrested because their colleagues have been arrested. They don't want to take any risk and that's the reason they have shut the bridge after BMC bridges department decided to demolish it. At least 10,000 cars use this bridge daily. It is the only connectivity between Santacruz and Juhu. They are taking everything for granted. They are not concerned about public but only concerned about saving their jobs now."

They said, "Chief Minister, a regular commissioner and civic activist from Santacruz to Juhu, students from Marathi College will be affected once school starts. The route and travel time for those living beyond SNIT is doubled if they have to go towards Bandra."

CM says LED street lamps a bright idea, will cut bills

What are the opposing arguments?

Replacing conventional lights with LED bulbs at Marine Drive has become a bone of contention between the ruling alliance, BJP and Sena.

On Thursday, the issue was put to discussion in the lower house through a calling attention motion. BJP legislators demanded replacement of the conventional lights by citing problems of law and order due to low illumination, while Sena legislator Sunil Prabhu along with NCP MLAs raised doubts on the life period and low level of LED lights.

Where will the lights be put up?

CM Fadnis made the announcement in the state assembly on Thursday despite stiff opposition from its ally Shiv Sena. The Maharashtra government will direct all the municipal corporations of the state to start using LED lights instead of conventional yellow lights. This includes use of LED lights in playgrounds, gardens and all type of public spaces apart from streetlights. "The state urban development department will issue directives to all the municipal corporations to start using LED lights and save energy," CM declared.

Why is the CM supporting LEDs?

The chief minister also clarified that various surveys being done by reputed institutions have proved that LED lights are any time better than the conventional yellow lights (sodium vapor lamps). He attempted to prove the benefits and durability of LEDs according to the changing times. "As per necessity of LED Standard 1944, minimum light on streets must be 30 lux levels. The sodium vapor lamps provide around this level while LED gives illumination of 50 lux level," the CM said.

But Sena's Sunil Prabhu said, "Low level of LED lights starts reducing very early which was proved even by experts from the field." NCP legislator Bhaaskar Jadhav urged the government to change LED lights with the conventional yellow lights, citing visibility problems at Marine Drive.

Govt pushes for LED lights all across state

Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis made it clear in the Assembly on Thursday that the government would push for the use of LED lights not just in Mumbai, but also all across the state.

Incidentally the statement comes on the day when Shiv Sena mouthpiece 'Saamant' carried an article with by-line of Executive Editor blaming Union Power Minister Piyush Goyal for the alleged corruption in promoting the LED lights.

In his reply to calling attention notice on the use of LED lights, Fadnis said his government will ask all municipal corporations in the state to replace ordinary lighting on streets with LED as they save cost as well as energy.

To objections from members that illumination levels of LED at Marine Drive and J.J. Ployer in Mumbai were very low, Fadnis said the number of LED bulbs would be increased, and that the LED at Marine Drive is a pilot project for efficiency testing.

"The LED installations would be done through bidding and in a transparent manner by E&S, a Government of India undertaking. Nobody will be favoured," he said.

Atul Bhatthalkar (BJP) demanded that LED installations be done in public places like gardens and playgrounds and not just on streets.

Jayant Patil (NCP) lauded the Sena members present in the house to register their protest over the issue, over which Sunil Prabhu (Shiv Sena) asked the chief minister to furnish details regarding the LED lights at Marine Drive.

Chief Minister pointed out that the demand to replace the lights at Marine Drive with LED was initiated from the Mumbai Corporation itself and the process of installing LED had been carried out keeping in with the due procedure.

Maharashtra considers life imprisonment for milk adulteration

Minister says existing provision in law are not deterrent enough to curb adulteration of milk

Minister Girish Bapat said the Centre has given its nod to amend the laws for stricter punishment for adulteration of milk by making the offence non-bailable.

The Maharashtra government said on Tuesday that it was considering amending the laws to make provision for punishment ranging between three years to life imprisonment for milk adulteration. Food and civil supplies minister Girish Bapat informed the legislative assembly and council on Tuesday that the amendments will be made in Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other related laws once the proposal was approved by the law and judiciary department.

Bapat said that at present there was provision of punishment of six months for people found responsible for milk adulteration. The existing provision in the IPC and other laws including Food Safety and Standards Act 2006 are not deterrent enough to curb the adulteration of milk, he said. Bapat said the Centre has given its nod to amend the laws for stricter punishment for the culprits by making the offence non-bailable.

"We are proposing the punishment ranging between three years to life imprisonment depending on the severity of the involvement. The amendment will be proposed in the IPC once the proposal is approved by the law and judiciary department," he said.

Bapat admitted that the four mobile testing vans that are in service to curb milk adulteration have failed to effectively perform in Mumbai, Konkan and other parts. He was replying to a calling attention motion moved by Ameet Satam (BJP), Radhakrishna Vikhe Patil (Congress) and others in the lower house. The issue was raised by Kiran Pawaskar (NCP) in the council. Bapat said the government was imparting training to the manufacturers of food items to avoid the adulteration at source.

The minister informed house that the department held a special surveillance drive on January 16 and 23 across the state and collected random samples of the milk supplied. In Mumbai, 2,700 litres of milk of the 4.62 lakh litres checked at the entry points were found to be sub standard and the stock was rejected.

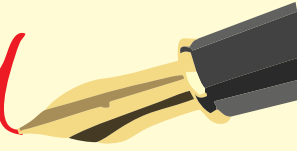
